


With the ANTIKENCARD PREMIUM you can visit four Roman monuments – Porta Nigra, Amphitheatre, Imperial Baths and Forum Baths – and the Landesmuseum. Additionally, both tickets offer reduced admission into the media theatre "In the Realm of Shadows", into the City Museum Simeonstift, into the Trier Cathedral Museum as well as a 10% discount for the Roman toga tours and adventure performances (available in german) from the Trier Tourismus und Marketing GmbH.

The admission for up to four children up to age 18 is included in the ANTIKENCARD BASIC and PREMIUM. Both tickets are valid for the entire calendar year.

MONUMENTS OF ANTIQUITY



AMPHITHEATER

Built in the 2nd century AD, the Trier Amphitheater offered seating for almost 18,000 spectators. The arena was a popular venue for an often bloody entertainment programme. You can view the chambers of the gladiators and the wild animals in the arena wall.



KAISERTHERMEN

The structure from Late Antiquity is representative of the period of the 4th to the 5th century. A fascinating animated film illustrates this era, when Trier was an imperial residence and thus one of the most important centres of the Roman Empire. The impressive

subterranean labyrinth of the massive ruin's service passageways invites visitors to a journey of discovery.

PORTA NIGRA

Colossal city gate and fortification: Trier's landmark offers an introduction into the past of Augusta Treverorum, Germany's oldest city. During a visit to Trier you can discover the eventful history of the best preserved city gate north of the Alps.

BARBARA BATHS

With its about 1,000 acres (more than 4 hectares) – about six soccer pitches – the monumental baths from the 2nd century AD were the second largest baths in the entire Roman Empire at the time they were constructed, a wellness oasis for visitors. The thermal baths can be visited via a walkway with nine stopping points.



FORUM BATHS

In the Forum Baths, archaeological evidence of a Roman bath as well as the remains of a monastery have been uncovered. The finds of different building phases offer an understanding into Trier's history. The preserved remains are on view in an impressive glass structure by the architect Oswald M. Ungers. Exhibitions are held in the facilities regularly.



RHEINISCHES LANDESMUSEUM TRIER

The Rheinisches Landesmuseum Trier is one of the most important museums in Europe treating Roman Antiquity. Highlights are the largest gold coin hoard from the Roman imperial period, the largest mosaic collection north of the Alps and the media theatre showing "In the Realm of Shadows", a unique multi-media show presented amidst gigantic Roman burial monuments.



JOURNEY INTO THE PAST

In Trier you meet testimony to ancient times at every turn.

Awaiting visitors are nine UNESCO World Heritage sites, all within a small area: Porta Nigra, Amphitheater, Imperial Baths, Barbara Baths, Imperial Throne Room, Roman Bridge and the Igel Column near Trier as well as Trier Cathedral and the Church of Our Lady. The Roman Villa Otrang is located in the Eifel mountain range and is always worth a trip.
