HANDICRAFTS IN ANCIENT ROME

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Just like us, the Romans had all kinds of objects to make domestic and everyday life more comfortable and convenient. Handicrafts accordingly played an important role, and specialization made them more efficient. FOOD AND DRINK IN THE ROMAN EMPIRE

Moretum, flamingo tongues, and sauce made of rotten fish—there are lots of bizarre conceptions about Roman culinary delights, some of them created by Roman gourmets like Lucullus and Apicius themselves. In July, the Imperial Baths is the place to go for interested culinarians. Forgotten herbs and spices will be introduced and show kitchens will treat the taste buds to new discoveries. But the experience wouldn't be complete without Roman-era winemaking on the Mosel – mulsum tasting and a winepress demonstration included!

GLADIATORS

Bread and games in ancient Rome – gladiator fights are a special fascination of the Roman age. Huge stadiums like the Colosseum were built and lured tens of thousands to come and watch the bloody spectacles.

THE ROMAN MILITARY

The military was the mainstay of the Roman Empire. Rome's territory was vast and the borders it had to secure accordingly long. On the military weekend, Roman infantry soldiers will demonstrate their weapons and combat techniques—for example the powerful torsion weapons.



Flying eagles were interpreted as a sign of victory: See the majestic birds circling the sky above the striking ruins of the Imperial Baths!
