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18,- ANTIKENCARD BASIC

Access to two roman buildings and the State Museum. Including entrance for up to four children up to age 18. Valid for one calendar year.

28,- ANTIKENCARD PREMIUM

Access to all roman buildings and the State Museum. Including entrance for up to four children up to age 18. Valid for one calendar year.

16,- ANTIKENCARD GROUP

Access to two roman buildings and the State Museum for groups of 10 and above, per person. Valid for one week from purchase. No further discounts.

6,- ANTIKENCARD SCHOOL

HANDICRAFTS IN ANCIENT ROME

At the start of May, Roman craftsmanship takes centre stage. Just like us, the Romans had all kinds of objects to make domestic and everyday life more comfortable and convenient. Handicrafts accordingly played an important role, and specialization made them more efficient. In the craftsmen's camp, visitors have the opportunity to look over the shoulders of Roman specialists and try out ancient crafts techniques themselves – with the gem cutter, the bow maker, in the Roman skriptorium, with ointments & cosmetics, with spinning & textiles... Fun for visitors of all ages!

6/7 June – Amphitheatre

GLADIATORS

Bread and games in ancient Rome – gladiator fights are a special fascination of the Roman age. Huge stadiums like the Colosseum were built and lured tens of thousands to come and watch the bloody spectacles. In June, the Trier Amphitheatre will once again become a gladiator training camp when the Trier Gladiator School presents brief show fights and provides interesting insights into the training and accommodation of the one-time sports celebrities.

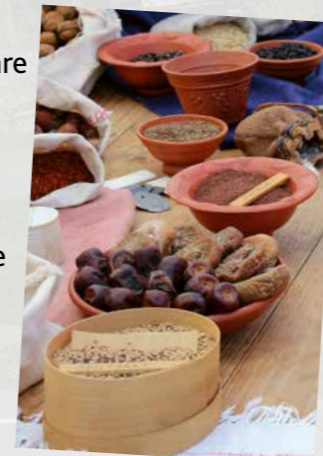
FOOD AND DRINK IN THE ROMAN EMPIRE

Moretum, flamingo tongues, and sauce made of rotten fish—there are lots of bizarre conceptions about Roman culinary delights, some of them created by Roman gourmets like Lucullus and Apicius themselves.



In August, the Imperial Baths is the place to go for interested culinarians.

Forgotten herbs and spices are presented, tasting kitchens allow flavourful discoveries and show kitchen utensils and working methods in the Roman field kitchen. And the Celts and Germanic tribes also let us take a look into their cooking pots.



5/6 September – Kaiserthermen

THE ROMAN MILITARY

The military was the mainstay of the Roman Empire. Rome's territory was vast and the borders it had to secure accordingly long. On the military weekend, Roman infantry soldiers will demonstrate their weapons and combat techniques – for example the powerful torsion weapons.



Flying eagles were interpreted as a sign of victory: See the majestic birds circling the sky above the striking ruins of the Imperial Baths!
